Students who are caught being safe, respectful, and responsible will have the opportunity to earn Eagle Eye Awards.

When a student receives an Eagle Eye Award, they give it to their classroom teacher, who displays the award in various ways. Each month, classes determine a goal number of Eagle Eye Awards to earn. Some classes have earned 300 in one month! Classes who meet their goal are in a drawing to have the “big eagle” visit their room. The “big eagle” visits one class per week.



Exceptional Eaglets

Each month, classrooms are asked to nominate 2-3 students as “Exceptional Eaglets.” Students are recognized by receiving their picture and a brief statement about what they did to receive the award displayed in a common location of the school. Congratulatory notes are also sent home to families of Exceptional Eaglets. Additionally, we recognize these students at an all-school assembly. These assemblies also kick-off our learning of our monthly character trait and are fun for all!
